TRANSITION PROJECT

As part of our annual transition project, Thursday 10th July was *Transition Day* when children visited their new classrooms and met their new teachers and TAs for September. The idea behind this is that children know what to expect in September and therefore don't worry over the long summer holiday.

Every child left school on that day with a booklet containing key information for the new school year. Please make sure you talk to your child about their visit and take time to go through the booklet with them. If they have any questions or concerns, please talk to a member of staff before we finish for the summer holiday.

Any child who was absent for *Transition Day* has been sent their booklet – parents, please check your email.

SUMMER HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES


Don't forget to register your child at the library for the free **SUMMER READING CHALLENGE.** The challenge is suitable for all children from 4-11 years and there is a special mini-challenge for children under 4.

Without regular practice and review, children can sometimes forget elements of their learning during the long summer break. Please help your child to keep up with their peers by practising their reading — and reading to them — over the holiday.



Children in upper school (Years 3-6) continue to have access to Times Tables Rockstars so they can keep up (or improve) their speed at recalling times table facts.

For younger children, 1-Minute Maths by White Rose Maths is a free App (also available on desktop) for practising adding, subtracting, multiplication and division in **one-minute** chunks. Just one minute a day will set your child up for a really good mathematical start in September.







Please also check your child's school report for 'Things to work on at home' for each of reading, writing and maths, as well as a general target.
